

Devotional Thought for March

I write this reflection as dusk has once again appeared outside my office windows, at the close of a day illumined by occasional sunbreaks, even as the local radio stations predicted a snow and ice storm. It is said that dusk is “the darker stage of twilight,” which is not a reference to the vampire-themed fantasy romance novels by American author Stephanie Meyer, but to the movement from day to night relative to the solar elevation angle θ_s , which is the position of the geometric center of the sun relative to the horizon. I don’t exactly understand what that means, but I am continually drawn to the twilight experiences of **dusk** and **dawn**.

On Wednesday, 9 March, we will gather in our sanctuary just after **dusk** to begin the season of Lent, a 40-day journey under the lengthening shadows of the cross. Intentionally living the days of Lent is to know God’s twilight hours of the liturgical cycle, holy moments that are mysterious and challenging. The questions, images, teachings, hymns, and silence of Lent draw us into the heart of God and strangely occasion a **dawning** well worth the dark and difficult journey.

I hope you will join me in observing an intentional Lent by devoting ourselves to silence, prayer, study, walking, careful fasting, and acts of kindness. In this edition of *The Keys*, you will read of the **Dusk to Dawn schedule of events** in which I hope you will enthusiastically participate. And let us continue to engage in **Holy Speaking and Listening**, discussing how we are growing in grace and how God is preparing us for ministry in 2011 and beyond. Please contact me and schedule a time when we can meet. May our journey into Lent grant us a deeper awareness of the twilight hours of everyday living and loving, dying and rising again. 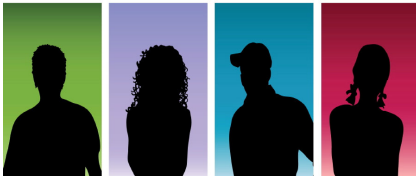
ioners "let down their hair!" There is no set program, we just gather for food, fun and fellowship.

Program also helps those on-the-mend

Most people know that Meals on Wheels is a national program that delivers meals to home-bound seniors to help them remain independent in their own homes, but did you also know that the organization helps out with meals *when you are recovering from surgery or an illness?* Participants may select 7-14 meals a week from a menu of 28 frozen dinner entrees and 5 breakfasts. Meals may be heated in a microwave, conventional or toaster oven. Orders are delivered once a week between 9 a.m. –2 p.m.

Pea Patch News

The St. Peter's church family was hosted for a soup and bread lunch after church on February 13 to talk about the community garden. **Lynn**

McKay, environmental horticulture teacher at Interlake High School and a professional landscape designer, was available to discuss the process she will use in designing the garden, answer questions, and hear comments.

The church has received a \$3000 grant from the Bellevue Rotary, with matching grants of \$4000 pledged. The final design will have a budget for creating the garden as well as covering ongoing expenses. Income to cover these costs will be in place before the garden is created.

In addition to budget and expenses, other questions concerned a design that will be attractive from the street, if the garden is located on the area currently covered in ivy adjacent to N.E. 8th street. Everyone wants the design to be attractive, containing some plants and trees that will



look good in the winter months when the garden areas are dormant.

Maintenance of the garden was discussed, in terms of an overall plan, requirements of users, water usage and plant restrictions, and oversight by a master gardener and group of dedicated volunteers. Lynn recommended that a tool shed, colorful signage, a picnic table and chairs and other amenities be included in the design. Organic gardening requirements, harvesting agreements, and other usage issues will be defined in the management plan that is also available prior to creating the garden. It was generally agreed that a portion of the harvest be donated to HopeLink and, possibly, for community meals at the church.

“Community” is being used in this discussion to mean the St. Peter's church family and the larger community living in and around the church. The gar-

den will be used to expand conversation and engagement with those around the church interested in being involved.

Lynn intends to visit several pea patch gardens prior to creating her design. **Shirley Lumry** will coordinate discussion with the city about water, utility and other buried lines, and any other city requirements. Several people volunteered to help with creating the management plan and other parts of the project. Lynn expects to have the design available to post at the church in March. At that time, there will also be an actual budget available to review.

The goal is to have the funding in place this spring so work can begin on the garden during this spring and summer.

Whether or not you’ve been attending the monthly series, you’re invited to come and gain a deeper understanding of Islam, its teachings and perspective.

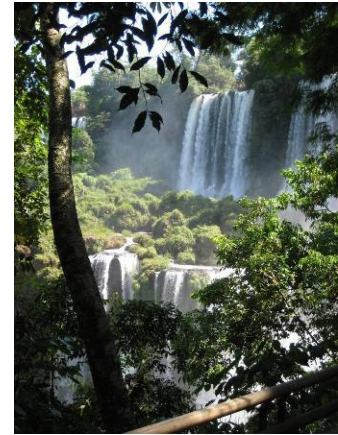

2012 EPISCOPAL AREA PLAN FOR THE WESTERN JURISDICTION

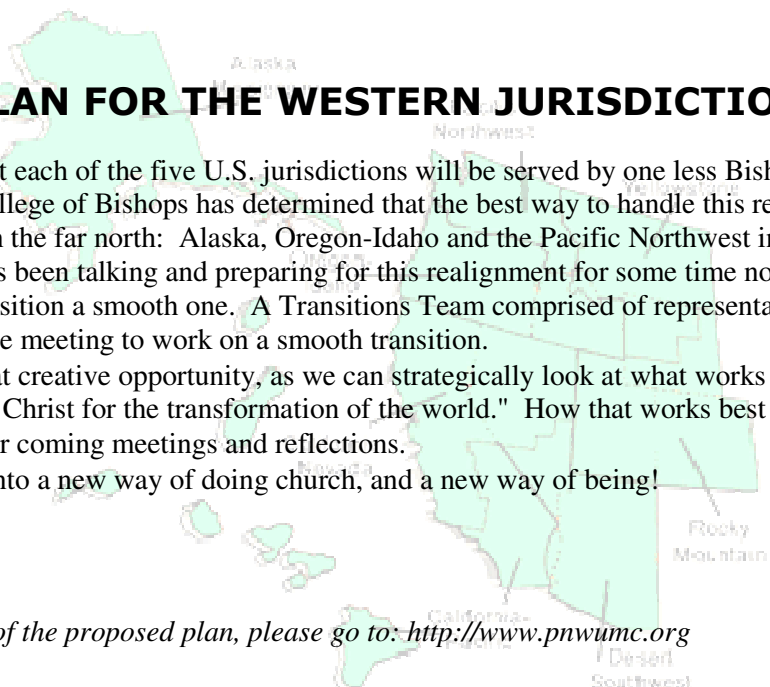

Our Western Jurisdiction College of Bishops has determined that the best way to handle this reduction is to align the three annual conferences in the far north: Alaska, Oregon-Idaho and the Pacific Northwest into one Episcopal Area. Our PNW leadership has been talking and preparing for this realignment for some time now, and we will continue to plan to make this transition a smooth one. A Transitions Team comprised of representatives from the three annual conferences will be meeting to work on a smooth transition.

Personally, I see this as a time of great creative opportunity, as we can strategically look at what works best for our mission of “Making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.” How that works best for Alaska and the PNW will be the subject of our coming meetings and reflections.

Continue to pray for us as we move into a new way of doing church, and a new way of being!

Dusk to Dawn: A Twilight Journey into the Mysteries of Lent

The rhythms of Lent are lived out while we journey to Jerusalem under the lengthening shadows of the cross. It has been said that “all journeys are rhapsodies on the theme of discovery.” The word *rhapsody* reminds us that our Lenten journey is rather irregular and improvisational. A “twilight” journey undertaken in shadows requires that we rediscover our powers of intuition and faith perception, particularly when walking by sight in clear light is unavailable. During the days of Lent, there are times when we no longer know where or when to turn, which is the moment we discover that the real journey has just begun.



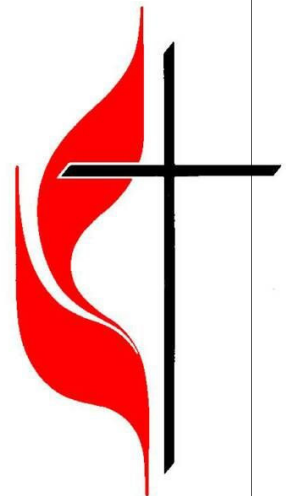
